It's SEPTEMBER and the girls are excited to have opportunity to attend school. We have Elementary, Junior High, and several in High School or Trade School.

The **Cost** this year to purchase uniforms, books, and pay for inscription will be **\$6,200** for the 26 girls.

Half the girls attend schools in Grand Bassam with varying schedules. We were blessed to have a van donated for transport which will eliminate unreliable taxis. So, we will need an additional \$2,000 to pay a driver for the school year.

We pray the Lord will place this need on the heart of those who can help. We are totally dependent on your financial gifts to keep the girls in school.










LaNelle and I sensed the call to missions nearly 33 years ago. Through the years in Ivory Coast, GOD has richly blessed, allowing us to establish 40 churches. On this trip, we had the privilege of personally visiting most of these churches. They are tucked away in villages along jungle paths in the "byways" of the Western Region. Some are old, surviving wars and the span of time, and some are relatively new

The people are poor monetarily but work hard to grow crops to support their families. Even though their villages are remote, the government still controls properties within the confines of their village, and by their standards, land on which to build a church is quite expensive.

In this NEWSLETTER we are asking for help, primarily, to purchase land for these churches. If churches have land, then they can start to build the worship structure themselves. Without land, they have no place to start.

We have shared, through facebook, photos of the churches we visited throughout our time here and expressed some of their needs. America has graciously responded and already fulfilled some of their requests.
