The *Jungle Riders* Evangelistic Team will be riding into remote villages during months of January through March. To date, they have shown the Jesus film in 9 villages. Crowds have ranged from 180 to more than 550 in attendance. A total of **148 persons responded to the GOSPEL** trusting Christ as Savior. Many more people gave their names requesting we visit their home for further counsel.



The team has 9 villages to go before the end of their January outreach, then they will take a short break and begin again in Feb. They are experiencing great responses.
