

There were so many tears when parting time came because of the love and closeness that had formed between them. This is a remarkable story that will go down as the greatest VBS event in the history of our mission. FBC, you have left a sweet incense behind and you will not be forgotten by the children or us.

Not only did FBC have an impact on the children but each day after VBS every team member put their work clothes on and did whatever needed to be done on the properties. Electricity and water were cut off much of the time, but I never heard one complaint from any team member. I've never seen a



team work so hard. What a blessing and an encouragement you were to us. Thank you for the heart you have shown for missions. And thank Faith Baptist Church for the financial donation for the completion of the dormitory unit. The work has been completed and the girls are moving into their new quarters, allowing us to accept more children.



It's September & Time For School - It's a 24/7 responsibility to provide food, shelter, clothing, medical, and school needs for the orphans, not to mention their emotional and spiritual needs. But God has touched hearts and so many provisions have been given by His people through the years. One promise we made was that we would support them in education as far they dared to go. We now have 3 in university, 3 in trade school, 14 in high school and jr high, and 2 in grade school plus 8 more on the way. There are 3 doing job related apprenticeships. The girls are getting older and the cost of schooling is significantly increasing each year. We need help! All we can do is ask and we leave the results in the Lord's Hands. Any amount will be a blessing and if enough people give the need will be met.

COST: Books, registration, fees, uniforms, supplies: \$14,606. Or, about \$500 per child per year.

COST: Transportation \$6,700. Or, about \$216 per child per year. (Schools are several miles from the orphanage in Grand Bassam or Abidjan.)
